



Centre for Stories X Perth Comic Arts Festival 2024 Comic Creator Hot Desk Fellowship Guidelines

Centre for Stories has partnered with Perth Comic Arts Festival to offer a Comic Creator Hot Desk Fellowship to one person who is both writing and illustrating a comic project.

1. Applications are open to people living in Western Australia who are current members of Perth Comic Arts Festival (PCAF). Centre for Stories is an inclusive organisation, and so we encourage people who identify as First Nations, living with disability, LGBTQIA+, and people of colour to apply.
2. Applicants are required to submit a sample of work in their application. This may be forwarded to Centre for Stories in the form of a link to the applicant's website or relevant online publication, or in the form of a PDF, Word Document, PNG, or JPEG.
3. The fellowship is open to a person who is both writing and illustrating a comic project. The comic project format is flexible and up to the applicant (e.g. minicomic, graphic novel, vertical scroll, comic strip series, etc.) as long as it consists of an original narrative told in graphic format with sequential art, with the equivalent of at least 12 standard comic book pages of story. The work completed during the fellowship may be a full short story, or a chapter/excerpt from a longer work.
4. Applications for comic projects involving the use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) technology to create their work will not be accepted.
5. Applications are to be completed online via the form: <https://centreforstories.com/comic-creator-fellowship> Please fill out the online application form and answer the questions carefully before submitting online.

6. Applications open Wednesday 24 January 2024 and close at 11.59pm on Sunday 25 February 2024. Late applications for this round will not be considered for selection.
7. The successful applicant will be contacted by email during the week starting 12 March 2024.
8. The successful applicant will receive a dedicated desk at the Centre for Stories for a minimum of 10 days spread out over 8 to 12 consecutive weeks. The successful applicant is expected to be present at the Centre for Stories for a minimum of six hours per nominated day, though specific start and finish times are negotiable depending on individual needs and external responsibilities. Centre for Stories will endeavour to support writers with disabilities and provide alternative options (e.g. working from home/remote, extended deadlines, space for a companion) and will maintain an open conversation to support your access needs.
9. Successful applicants will determine their hot desk schedule in collaboration with Centre for Stories and will complete their hot desk in a period of 8 to 12 consecutive weeks between 18 March 2024 and 1 July 2024. The successful applicant must commence their hot desk no later than 8 April 2024.
10. The successful applicant will be profiled on Centre for Stories' and PCAF's website and social media. On request, successful applicants agree to provide a photograph for publicity purposes and agree to Centre for Stories or PCAF publishing an excerpt from their work-in-progress on their websites.
11. The successful applicant may be invited to participate in a public in-conversation event held at the Centre for Stories, at a local festival, or online via Zoom.
12. The successful applicant will have the opportunity to work from Centre for Stories' Northbridge venue, attend Centre for Stories events and workshops, attend networking events, interact with other writers, and seek support from Centre for Stories staff. They will also receive regular check-ins and support from a mentor from the PCAF committee.
13. The successful applicant is required to work on at least one comic project that they are both writing and illustrating and are not permitted to work on tasks or projects unrelated to their creative writing practice (including thesis/PhD's and other academic dissertations) while at the Centre for Stories.
14. It is expected that the successful applicant will complete a substantial portion of work (e.g. full short story, a chapter/excerpt from a longer work). PCAF will

provide print design assistance and a free Market Day table for the exhibition of this work.

15. The final outcome of the fellowship will be a print edition to be exhibited at PCAF's Market Day at the State Library of Western Australian on 28 July 2024.
16. Writers will receive a stipend of \$1500 for their participation and a \$200 printing cost allowance.
17. The printing allowance will be organised as part of PCAF's print design mentorship to assist the fellow with related expenses.
18. Payment of the stipend will be made in three parts – the first payment to be made at completion of the first 4 weeks, the second at the completion of 8 weeks, and the final upon completion of the fellowship, including the submission of a completed work to the Centre for Stories and PCAF on the 1 July 2024 deadline.
