- Applications are invited from people who identify as a Person of Colour, CaLD, First Nations, LGBTQIA+ and/or living with disability who are currently living in Western Australia and are over the age of 18.
- 2. Applicants are required to fill out the submission form online at www.centreforstories.com/early-career-fellowship. Please fill out the application form and answer the questions carefully.
- 3. Applications open 3 June 2024 and close at 11.59pm on 30 June 2024.
- 4. Applicants must have a completed full draft of a manuscript of fiction or non-fiction.

 Manuscripts are to be no longer than 100,000 words.
- 5. Applicants are required to provide a manuscript pitch and/or summary (no longer than 1 page). Manuscripts are to be submitted in Word Doc format.
- 6. Applicants must show evidence of at least three publications (e.g. print journal, print anthology, digital journal, chapbook, webtoon, and /or a previously published book).
- 7. Successful applications will be contacted by email in the weeks following 7 July 2024.
- 8. Successful applicants agree to participate in the project from July 2024 to June 2025. Applicants must be available to attend:
 - 1. Online workshop on Saturday 20 July 2024 from 9am-3pm.
 - 2. Writing retreat in Margaret River from 12-13 April 2025.
- 9. Successful applicants will receive a full manuscript assessment, an additional round of edits on their manuscript, manuscript test reader feedback, access to workshops, a weekend retreat in Margaret River and the opportunity to have their work reviewed by Fremantle Press via the Centre for Stories submissions portal.
- 10. Successful applicants will be profiled on the Centre for Stories' website and social media.
 On request, successful applicants agree to be photographed for publicity purposes.
- 11. Applicants must have been involved in a writing program in Australia over the last 4 years. This may include any Centre for Stories past writing programs (e.g. 'Writing Change, Writing Inclusion', 'Green Leaves Red River', 'Inclusion Matters', 'Inner-City Residency' and so on) or other writing programs outside of the Centre for Stories.
