### Mastering Creative Research with Ana Brawls + FROM DESIGN TO SERENDIPITY


Join our free workshop with Ana Brawls about harnessing the power of research to boost your creative work, from designing your research plan to embracing the serendipity of unexpected discoveries.

Ana Brawls was the recipient of the Neilma Sidney Literary Travel Fund from Writers Victoria and The Myer Foundation earlier this year. In preparing for her next manuscript, Ana chose to research on location in Rio de Janeiro and Sao Paulo visiting Libraries, Museums and Institutes preserving heritage and culture. During the workshop she will use her writing process and research to demonstrate how to:

- Prepare and design research for creative work
- Methods for collating information
- Apply the findings into your work
- Lessons learned and the serendipity in coming across information
- Practice: Designing research to suit your work

This workshop is best suited to writers planning or interested in using research to develop their creative work. It is suited to writers who haven't researched or would like to see other ways to approach research.

## Do you know about our writing programs?

### **All Write**

Funded by the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries and Centre for Stories' Founders Circle, All Write offers a series of opportunities for diverse writers, including hot desks, events, residencies, publications, networking, and exchanges.

- Early Career Fellowship Awarded to writers who have completed a manuscript of fiction
  or non-fiction, the Early Career Fellowship includes a full manuscript assessment, reader
  feedback, access to workshops, a desk at Centre for Stories, and a weekend retreat in Margaret
  River. Applications are currently open and will close on 28 October 2024.
- Hot Desk Fellowship Fellows receive a stipend and a desk at Centre for Stories, plus access
  to Centre for Stories events, library resources and networks. Fellows are also profiled on
  Centre for Stories' website and social media. Applications re-open in February 2025.

### **Word Up & Write Up: Youth Storytelling**

Word Up and Write Up are Centre for Stories' signature youth oral storytelling and creative writing programs. We believe that storytelling empowers young people to be the best versions of themselves. Our workshops are designed to support young people to improve literacy, build confidence, and embrace creativity. We do this by providing young people with the skills and platform to share true stories about who they are and what matters to them. Centre for Stories works primarily with young people aged 12-18 from under-resourced communities and culturally and linguistically diverse (CaLD) backgrounds.
